Transition Timeline:

- Spring 2024: MAT1420, MAT1440
- Summer 2024: 1400, 2410, 2420, 2430, 2431, 2450, 2560, 2561
- Fall 2024: 0100, 0250, 0300, 1120, 1140, 1150, 1160, 1220, 1230, 1240, 1260, 1320, 1340

We went over course materials for RTT courses.

Discussion about 2561:

- Differential Equations/Engineering Applications:
 - Will keep on the schedule

Discussion about 2562:

- Diff EQ/Linear Algebra:
 - Offer online? Who will develop? Anyone teaching in the spring? Just me (Joyce Treulieb). It was suggested that I could develop the course.

Discussion about 2500: Intro to Proofs and Reasoning

- Should we archive? We are trying to figure out how hard it would be to bring it back if we need to

Cross-Listing of DAT001 – RRCC:

- The need to have calculus based stats
- Cross list DAT (Data Science) with an MAT
- Colorado School of Mines needs a calculus based stats course

New Math State Discipline Co-Chair:

- We started nominations and then to vote.
 - We decided to do it by College
 - We took volunteers: The only one was Johanna Debrecht
 - We voted and she is in

Co-Req Discussion:

- We have had the freedom to explore, but now we have to come together to finalize everything.
- The only data we have is for College Algebra
- Everyone was doing a different number of credits
 - We must all do the same amount
- This does not control sister schools (which is what we, CMC, are)
- Tutoring is trickier to use in place of Co-Req classes even though SAI are sometimes taught like that.
- Two separate classes must have 2 separate grades
- Pass rate for support class 0340 was higher than the gateway course 1340

- 0340 is SAI: 1,2,3, and 4 credits were given.
 - We must have a common number of credits: It will be 2 credits with 2 contact hours
 - We must phase out variable credits
 - We will keep lab numbers and SAI settings of 0340 and 0300
 - Variable credits are only for internships

- Pooled sections must be in the catalog:
 - The deadline is fall 2024

- Online Proctoring:
 - We must discuss this more
 - Individual disciplines will weigh in

- We discussed course material for the RTT courses

- Coreq: Danen:
 - Decided we will not vote today

- Pooled courses must be the same across the system

- SAI must have a single credit offering

- Some colleges won't take Calculus courses that are not proctored

- Lab vs. SAI: Lab – 1 credit, SAI – 2 credits, but instructors are only paid for 1 credit

- Students pay more for pooled sections

- Online is more expensive

- Data shows SAI model is more than the lab model
 - The content is the same
 - The difference is in the payment

- Course Materials Q&A:
 - There were not a lot of questions

- Proctoring Services:
 - On campus is an option
 - Public Library as an option?

- Online Proctoring:
 - We will form a subcommittee
 - One campus used to use Examinty

- Proctoring services are known to have huge inequities
- We could require Face-to-Face proctoring
- Colorado School of Mines and Arizona need proctoring for Calculus courses. (They can count as electives if not proctored, but not count for the degree).

- There was concern about HLC if we don't proctor
- Some on the East Coast got in trouble with HLC for not proctoring
- Consensus was for proctoring for some courses
- We talked about Honor Lock

- "Math For All" will be at CU Boulder April 5 and 6: 5th is virtual, and 6th in person
- Colomatyc will be at CMC this year (campus not determined)
- MAA at UCCS in mid April
- We discussed concerns about classes being canceled and forced into pooled courses.
- The caps for online classes is now at 34
