My name is Ivy Gerber, and I am a former student of Professor Joyce Treulieb. Currently, I am a second-year student at the University of Denver studying Spanish and Strategic Communication. My senior year of high school, as a part of the dual-enrollment program between Steamboat Springs High School and CMC, I took College Algebra with Professor Treulieb, and it was the best experience I have had in a math class over the entirety of my academic career past and present.

My initial impression of Professor Treulieb as an instructor was her ability to make math concepts receivable and accessible for students with varying learning styles, not just those with a proclivity towards math. Over the course of my K-12 education, math classes came as a challenge to me, and as a result I developed a low confidence in STEM related courses. That fall semester, I went into College Algebra apprehensive. Not only was this my first college level class, it happened to be in my weakest subject. Additionally, due to Covid-19 the class was taught online, a mode in which I already experience significant difficulty learning through, subject matter aside. Nonetheless, Professor Treulieb had a distinct ability to explain the material in a comprehensible framework that made sense to me. However, she was also equally successful in instructing people in class whose strength *was* in math, like my brother Eli, who is now a college student studying mechanical engineering. At the end of the semester, I ended with an above satisfactory grade, and more importantly a higher confidence in my math ability, an invaluable takeaway, especially now that I am a student at DU.

I appreciated her laid-back teaching style, and her approachability as my professor. Professor Treulieb created a collaborative atmosphere, not a competitive one, a quality new to me in a math class; previously I had experienced unnecessary pressure from my instructor and peers. Even though it was online—a structure that, by nature, can be difficult to establish an atmosphere that facilitates and encourages two-way dialogue between student and instructor—my classmates and I felt comfortable to speak up and ask questions, knowing that they would be received without judgment or inhibition.

Furthermore, given the pandemic and what it meant academically at the time, Professor Treulieb handled the circumstances with grace and it was apparent that she cared about our wellbeing not just as students but as people during an unprecedented period. She was fair and appropriately lenient with coursework expectations. We learned lots of math, yes, but we also had the opportunity to casually converse with both classmates and her frequently. This community dynamic I grew to look forward to each week. Additionally because of this, we got to know Professor Treulieb not only as an instructor of math, but as a person and admirable mentor for college students. She has a great sense of humor, and is passionate about math and about supporting her students in their endeavors—attributes that I have rarely observed in professors, and which made learning (especially a subject I dislike) tolerable, gratifying, and even enjoyable at times.

I had an extremely positive experience taking math with Professor Treulieb. As a former student, I hope you consider Professor Treulieb for this well-deserved promotion.
