My service to students includes many activities. First, I advise students in their academic pursuits every semester, along with participating in SOAR every semester where I introduce myself, my program, and the clubs that I advise. I also volunteer to do this in the summers.

Second, I tutor students in our Learning Lab. I do my office hours in there, and I tutor students from other math classes in addition to my own. I also always attend the luncheon after graduation when it is presented. I try to sit with students and their parents to support their experience at Colorado Mountain College.

I served on a Winter Break Housing Committee which was a success. Prior to this committee, students were not allowed to stay in the Residence Hall during winter break. This created a hardship for many students who were employed in town. Allowing some students to stay over winter break for a fee was a large help to many students.
